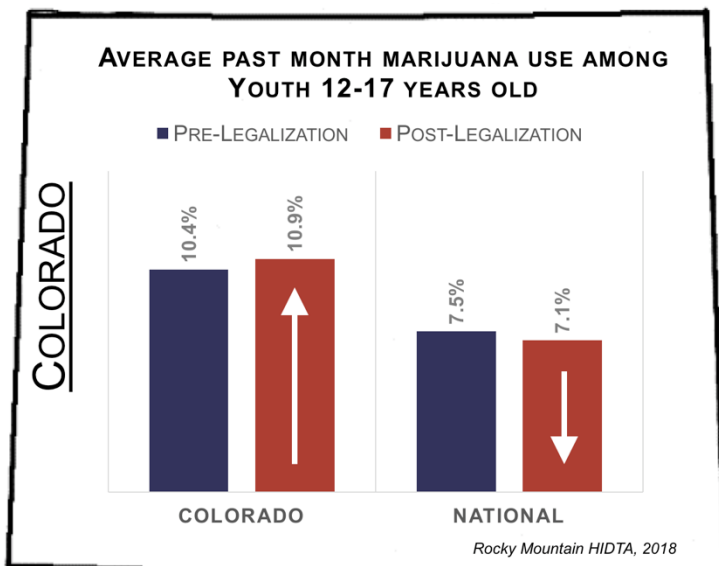


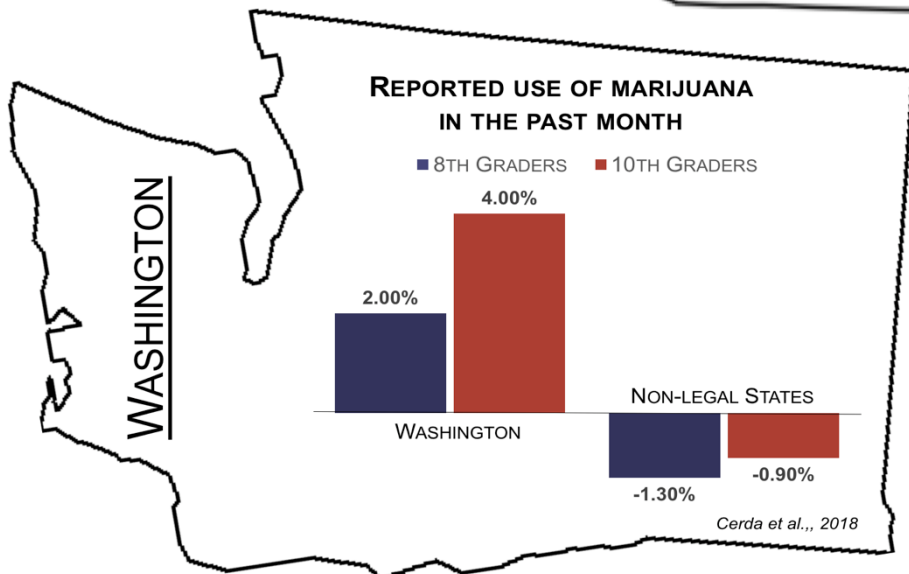
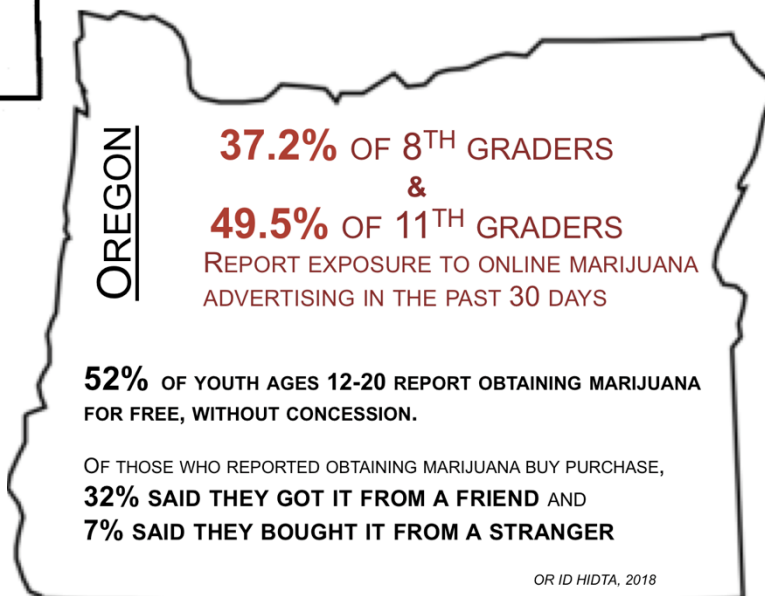
YOUTH MARIJUANA USE IN LEGALIZED STATES
